RAC Bulletin 98-90E Emergency Coordinator's Manual

This is a reminder to all ARES SEC. DEC and EC appointments that the RAC Emergency Coordinator's Manual is available for downloading free of charge from the RAC web site. This essential RAC ARES manual is in a password-protected area, so it is imperative that we have your, or your appointed representative's e-mail address to send you the password. All of the above appointments who have not received your password and downloaded the manual should advise me immediately of your or your representative's e-mail address so that you may be assigned your password. Appointments who are not on e- mail and cannot designate a representative to receive the password, can request a photocopy of the 90 page manual from RAC Headquarters for a nominal cost of \$10.00 including handling, postage and tax. If neither of the above is possible for you, please contact me and we will find an acceptable solution.

The last section of the RAC Emergency Coordinator's Manual contains the optional Emergency Coordinator Certification open-book examination. We encourage all SEC, DEC and EC appointments (and even Section Managers) to obtain the manual, write and submit the exam to me. Successful candidates will receive a diploma and listing as a CEC on the RAC web site.

RAC Bulletin 98-93E Membership increase rescinded

A major restructuring plan at RAC, leading to an operating expense reduction of \$80,000 to be realized mainly through reductions in paid staff, decrease in office floor

space rental and costs of publishing TCA is under preparation. As a first step in this process, RAC's Directors have approved passing along part of these operating cost savings to members by rescinding the \$10.00 membership fee increase. This will reestablish cost of membership at \$39.95 and make it more affordable for Canadian Radio Amateurs to belong to their national organization.

The \$10.00 membership fee increase is rescinded immediately and any members who paid the at the \$49.95 rate will be compensated. Watch for announcement of a new membership campaign in November at the \$39.95 rate with prizes and other incentives.

RAC Manitoba QSL Bureau Bulletin

Fellow Radio Amateurs:

For most of its existence, the Manitoba QSL Bureau has used Method C for the purpose of QSL card distribution to Manitoba ham operators. This method required participating hams to provide the Bureau with self-addressed envelopes as well as money for postage. When either or both envelopes and/or money became depleted, hams were advised by notice to renew same.

For a variety of reasons, not the least of which is a collection of multi-sized envelopes, no envelopes, constant reminders etc., I have decided to switch to Method B.

This method only requires that ham participants provide the funds to cover costs and I will purchase the necessary envelopes. Normally, this would be a mammoth task to address all envelopes that would be needed for any particular mailing. Needless to say, I am not quite that ambitious! With the help of RAC headquarters and our colleagues in the Moncton area, I have acquired a computer program to print address labels based on the latest information provided by Industry Canada as the data base. Believe me, this makes the task a great deal simpler!

As well as an up-to-date address being printed on each label, the following information appears after the individual's call sign:

VE4SN c 8 \$ 4.65

The number after the "c" indicates the number of cards being mailed, and the figure after the dollar sign indicates the amount of money remaining in the postage fund. This facility will preclude the necessity of constant reminders to update your funds.

Besides the cost of postage, individual funds will be responsible for cost of envelopes, (\$0.07 for the small ones and \$0.11 for the larger ones, tax included). One cent will also be deducted for cost of each address label.

I feel that this system will be much more efficient than the previous one. All that ham subscribers to the Bureau will have to provide are the funds with no worry about envelopes. From my standpoint, the process of mailing will be easier and I won't have to concern myself with constant reminders being sent out (and ignored)... hi! Method B will be implemented immediately. The "OSCAR" Award - How It Got Its Name

I ask to be excused for my inability to express myself adequately at the time of presentation.
